As a result of the solicitation we made last Spring, the **Grad Board** Governance Committee is now reviewing applications from a number of post-2013 Cannon alumni to join us on the Board. As a result, we have begun to explore the feasibility of an expansion of the kitchen, servery and dining room areas. We will be moving slowly and deliberately on this, and I will keep you updated

about what we decide in future months. Be assured that whatever we do, it will be to ensure the future physical and financial soundness of Cannon Dial Elm, so it can best serve both our future undergraduate members and you, our equally important alumni members.
