Don't Harvard Our Princeton



If you DID make it back to campus for Homecoming you saw an overwhelming reaction to the <u>University's proposed new dining</u> plan that would require all Club members to purchase a <u>University Dining hall meal plan for \$900/year IN ADDITION to their meal contract with their Eating Club</u>. Virtually all members of Eating Clubs wore t-shirts with the name of our website <u>DONTHARVARDOURPRINCETON.COM</u>. The same text appeared on yard signs and posters in all the clubs, and even

on a banner pulled by a small plane flying over the stadium during the Havard game.

Big News

My BIG NEWS is that the University has acknowledged the alumni uprising and their threats to withhold donations. As a result, next year, juniors and seniors will now be given the right to 2 free meals a week in the dining halls (essentially the same thing they do now) but will be able to bank those free meals to use over holiday breaks when some students, and particularly inseason athletes, remain on campus. That is a big help for Cannon athletes.

This is a DIRECT RESULT of alumni response to the appeals made by the eating clubs to their alumni. So, I offer a BIG THANK YOU to every Cannon Dial Elm alum who reached out to President Eisgruber or the Annual Giving Office to register their opposition to the plan.

But, before we celebrate this victory for the clubs too hard, we need to remember that the University's campaign against the clubs, and particularly the selective clubs, will no doubt continue, with the ultimate goal of making them into small dining halls open to all students. The best way for you, as CANNON DIAL ELM ALUMNI, to defeat this University objective is to allow our club to remain among the most desirable to join on the Street.
